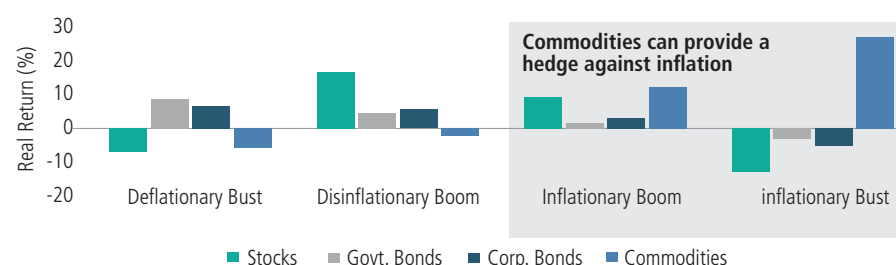

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Commodities Can Make Portfolios More Diversified Against Macro Outcomes

Commodities have historically acted as an inflation hedge while also diversifying stocks and bonds during negative return environments

An Active Approach to Investing in Commodities

Systematic process informed by fundamental research invests in a diversified basket of commodities

- Penalize Volatility** > Unlike traditional assets, risk tends not to be rewarded in commodities over the long term
- Emphasize Scarcity** > Favor commodities that tend to be scarce as the value of commodities is, in part, directly related to scarcity
- Enhance Alpha** > Tactical exposure adjustments, optimized derivative contract selection, and active collateral management expand alpha sources

The **Market Price** is the official closing price as of the closing time of the NYSE Arca (typically 4 p.m., Eastern time). **Net Asset Value (NAV)** is determined at the close of each business day, and represents the dollar value of one share of the Fund; it is calculated by taking the total assets of the fund, subtracting total liabilities, and dividing by the total number of shares outstanding. The NAV is not necessarily the same as the ETF's intraday trading value. ETF investors should not expect to buy or sell shares at NAV.

* Prior to close of business on October 21, 2022, Neuberger Berman Commodity Strategy ETF operated as an open-end mutual fund, Neuberger Berman Commodity Strategy Fund (the "Predecessor Fund"). The ETF has the same investment objective, strategy, restrictions and portfolio managers as the Predecessor Fund. Prior to the ETF's listing on October 24, 2022, the NAV performance of the ETF and the Institutional Class Shares of the Predecessor mutual fund are used as proxy market price returns.

¹ The **Bloomberg Commodity Index** is composed of commodities traded on U.S. exchanges, with the exception of aluminum, nickel and zinc, which trade on the London Metal Exchange (LME). The Bloomberg Commodity Index is calculated on a total return basis and reflects the return on fully collateralized positions in the underlying commodity futures. Please note that indices do not take into account any fees and expenses of investing in the individual securities that they track, and that individuals cannot invest directly in any index. Data about the performance of this index are prepared or obtained by the Manager and include reinvestment of all dividends and capital gain distributions.
